JACKSON – A husband and wife team from the Mississippi Department of Corrections are delivering donated school supplies today to two 3rd grade classrooms affected by Hurricane Harvey in Houston, Texas.

The items, including book bags, crayons, notebooks and pencils, had been collected since September through the Gulfport and Biloxi Probation and Parole offices.
